



Mental health in black and hispanic communities is very overlooked








For every one thousand babies

Statistical Data

43%

Black children are 43% more likely to not have access to medications

60%

Black children are 60% more likely to be diagnosed with asthma than white children.

26%

Black children are 26% more likely to be re-admitted into hospitals

74%

Only 74% of black and hispanic children receive the recommended vaccinations by age 6


Behavioral Skills

While progression has been made to combat these issues, the racism our country was founded upon still exists and the problems that arise because of it are still very prevalent.

























